As I watched it I could see that there was lightning in some of the clouds close to the plane. There was quite a bit of wind for I could feel the plane rocking; however, as I looked to the Lord I could feel the winds lessening, but because of the solid clouds below us the pilot felt that we wouldn't stop in Fort Worth, Texas as was scheduled but go on to Oklahoma City. The clouds broke just before we got to the City so that when we landed, we had to descend rather rapidly, but the Lord had His hand over the plane so we had a safe trip.

Well, I will confess it was a relief to know that you had arrived safely, and we thank God for his protection. Now, tell us about the interest shown by those who have been attending the services in Mexico.

(Kathleen) The people take quite a bit of interest in the services. They love to choose the songs which they sing. Of course, nearly everyone has a song they want to sing. One of the elder sisters had a song that she wanted to sing, but she just never got a chance to select it. We always took her home after service, so as she got out of the truck she said, "Sister, when we have service the next time, couldn't we please sing 'Oh, Que' Amigo'?" which in English is "What a Friend We Have in Jesus".

Thank you, Kathleen, for that interesting information about how God is calling for people of every nation to serve Him. Now, please give a little message in Spanish to all who are listening in Mexico.

(Kathleen) Saludas a todos quien estan en Mexico. Hay un versiculo que dice: "Dios es amor." Este amor es por todos porque con Cios, no hay diferencia. El tiene amor por todo el mundo.

And, how about a little interpretation in English for that?

(Kathleen) Greetings to all who are in Mexico. There is a verse which says: "God is love." This love is for everyone for with God there is no difference. He has love for all the world.

Very good, now, here is a song for you about a happy meeting. I am sure this will include people of all nations who are prepared to meet him.

Well, thank the Lord, friends, for that wonderful hope that we are looking forward to when the day that God will call for His own from this world.

For our text, I would like for you to take a look at this scripture in Proverbs 22:28. "Remove not the ancient landmark, which thy fathers have set."

Now a landmark is some outstanding structure, tree, or a stake placed in the ground to be remembered. Many times it is a starting point to survey some plot of ground. This is a permanent point from which other measurements may be made. Then if this starting point or landmark is removed or changed, you can readily see that all of the other measurements will be in error. Defore long the yardstick of measurement will mean nothing at all because the starting point has been removed.

Now I shall not keep you in suspense any longer as to what I am considering at this time. This is the very sacred and vital subject of:

## MARRIAGE

God made provision for the first man, Adam, to have a helpmeet. See Genesis 2:22. This was provided by the creation of God. There is no greater earthly asset to a man than a devoted and loving wife. To forbid to marry is a doctrine contrary to the scriptures and is not supported by the Word of God. So we see then that "marriage is honourable in all." Hebrews 13:4.

But, having established this landmark by the scriptures, let us now also use the same yardstick to begin measuring how far we may go in dealing with this sacred covenant between husband and wife and remain in favor and the will of God.

First, let us consider the heathen. It is not at all uncommon for some notable chief to have many wives, say 10 or 15, and this—all at one time. Would you say this was in the order and will of God? Most certainly not, for even nature itself teaches contrary to this. But now we come to one of the outstanding sins of this modern day living—that of divorce and remarriage.

Altogether too many times one takes the attitude that they will get married on a trial basis. If it fails to work, all that is necessary is to go down and file divorce proceedings, and after a short waiting period, (in some cases, and in other cases no such waiting is required) they are then eligible to follow the slogan: "If at first

So from one companion to another they go and still on a trial basis. Sometimes even after the children are grown, and people have lived together 25 years, then they decide they cannot agree and begin looking for another companion! Doesn't this really sound a little foolish? Nevertheless, the fact remains that it is true!

Many times this scripture which Jesus gave to the woman at the well would be applicable when he said to her in John 4:18: "For thou hast had five husbands; and he whom thou now hast is not thy husband, in that saidst thou truly."

Now some may ask: "Well, what business of yours is this? You are intruding into other people's affairs!"

Listen, friends, any time that the percentage of divorces begin to equal the number of marriage licenses issued, it is time that someone made it their business to speak out against this prevailing evil! Homes are being wrecked daily, children are placed in orphanages, thrown upon the public welfare, or left to roam the streets without proper teaching and care. No wonder, the crime rate begins to soar, and we wonder what we are going to do with juvenile deliquents! We should rather ask in many cases: "What are we going to do with the adult delinquents?"

Let me leave with you this scripture in Romans, chapter 7 and verse 2. "For the woman which hath an husband is bound by the law to her husband so long as he liveth; but if the husband be dead, she is loosed from the law of her husband." And, of course, that goes for the husband or the wife, either one.

Now speaking of landmarks, please notice this verse in Psalms 11:3. "If the foundations be destroyed, what can the righteous do?" The basis of our freedom is founded in the home. The beginning of true wisdom begins in the home. Then if the home is destroyed, where are we headed?

Let us pray:

Our Father,

We pray for that home which is nearest to the breaking point. We beseech Thee that hardened hearts may be awakened to the love of God, and that in turn, this love may radiate from each one who will hear the gospel message in Christ's name. Amen.
