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. . . A very pleasant greeting once more and a hearty welcome to all who are listening to The Mission Trail of Guthrie. I hope each of you are enjoying the rich blessings of God which He so freely gives us all.

Another thing--I want to tell you I have been made happy in recent weeks by the warm response which we have gotten from those who hear the broadcast and also those who receive the printed copies each week. In case some may not have heard, we mail these copies to those who request them. But your kind words of encouragement have meant so much to us.

For our scripture text now I am thinking of a scripture which says:

"YE ARE MY WITNESSES, SAITH THE LORD,

and my servants whom I have chosen; that ye may know and believe me, and understand that I am he; before me there was no God formed, neither shall there be after me. I, even I, am the Lord; and beside me there is no saviour. I have declared, and have saved, and I have shewed, when there was no strange god among you: therefore ye are my witnesses, saith the Lord, that I am God." Isaiah 43:10-12

These verses have a storehouse of spiritual wealth wrapped in them, and I hope we may uncover a little of it in this brief message.

First let us notice that twice here it is said: "ye are my witnesses". Now a witness is one who gives a report of that which he knows to be true. This account may be either good or bad. In some court trials the one who is accused, or the defendant, never speaks a word in behalf of himself, either

good or bad; however, there will be brought in those who will take a vow to tell the truth in behalf of the defendant. These people are known as witnesses. There are those who will speak in favor of the accused one, and then others will speak of the unlawful acts which he may have committed. In the meantime there will be the jury who will listen to all these reports. Their responsibility is to determine which witnesses are telling the truth and then decide whether the accused one shall go free or be condemned.

There have been cases brought to trial where false witnesses were brought in, and because of their many accusations, sometimes an innocent person has been sentenced to a life of imprisonment.

On the other hand, there are times when a very notable wicked person has gone unpunished because of those who witnessed in his behalf.

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Now let us take another look at the scripture. God affirms in truth that there is no other either before Him, neither shall there be any after Him. He declares that He is the Lord, "and beside me there is no saviour".

However it is well for us to remember that God uses human lips to speak for Him now. He uses human minds to make decisions and human feet to carry out His worthy purpose. Without these human instrumentalities, His cause would suffer under the false accusations of witnesses who care not for the souls of men.

But now here is where you and I come in. He has declared "ye are my witnesses". God is counting on us to speak up for Him. He wants us to do this unashamed. One song writer penned these words which have long since become indelibly impressed into the minds of those who remember them when he said: "Must I fear to own His cause or blush to speak His name?"

I am thinking of some of the ways in which we may be good witnesses for the truth. Today in this age in which we live, many spiritual values are being attacked and torn down. That which was once considered to be basic truth for many years is no longer immune to the gain-saying criticism of those who profess to love God, but in works they deny Him.

Therefore, I would say that one of the best ways in which we may be a good witness is to stand upon the word, The Holy Bible.

Its teachings are being attacked by the vilest of wicked men which include some of the most highly polished and educated professors who endeavor to break down the moral and spiritual concepts of its teachings.

Especially is this danger great in the modern school systems. When the so-called philosophers exhaust their ability to reason out the creation of God, then they resort to speculation and assuming. Therefore, they assume that the process of human life is a matter of evolution rather than of creation.

This error soon leads to another and before long there are no basic landmarks on which to establish faith in God. Then all faith is discarded and they tell us to be free thinkers—to think for yourself. This they then think, works very well until you decide to think of returning to faith in God, but upon this they frown, because it cannot be explained to their satisfaction.

Now let me direct a few thoughts toward our young people of today. While you are forming opinions and being instructed in school is a very important time. I would suggest, therefore, that you refuse to accept the modern theories of evolution and speak up as a witness for Christ. Leave all of this foolish reasoning about mankind evolving from a tiny animal to his present state to others who are willing to risk their souls and happiness in the hands of some professor who must stand before God and there give an account of the manner in which he has instructed others. Refer them to Genesis 1:1 which says: "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth." Or remind them of Psalms 53:1: "The fool hath said in his heart, there is no God."

There are many ways in which we may witness for Christ. Our manner of speech, manner of dress, our places of amusement. All of these witness either for or against the cause of God!

Now, in the midst of all these changes, let me ask you this question: "What kind of a witness are you? Are you a good witness for the cause of God?" I hope so.
