A New Year - New Opportunities for God

The New Year

I am the New Year, and I come to you
pure and unstained,
Fresh from the hand of God.
Each day, a precious pearl to you is
given
That you must string upon the silver
thread of Life.
Once strung it can never be unthreaded
but stays
An undying record of your faith and skill.
Each golden minute link you then must
weld into the chain of hours
That is no stronger than its weakest
link.
Into your hands is given all the wealth
and power
To make your life just what you will.
I give to you, free and unstinted, twelve
glorious months
Of soothing rain and sunshine golden;
The days for work and rest, the nights
for peaceful slumber.
All that I have I give with love unspoken.
All that I ask--you keep the faith un-
broken!

Friends, I hope you like the thought
expressed in those words. It seems
that I can see new opportunities before
us in the year which is just ahead.

Do you realize that today is December
31, the closing of another year? 1967
is almost a matter of record. We
cannot undo or change our actions which

we have done throughout the old year.
I believe that we should realize our
dependency upon God and that we should
consider our weaknesses--yes, perhaps
even our shortcomings in the year which
is almost gone. But I hope that we will
not look at our failures so long that we
will fail to lift up our eyes and see the
possibilities before us as we launch
into this new year with renewed hope
and courage to accomplish more for
God than we have ever done in the past.

Listen to this scripture from the
13th chapter of Luke, beginning at
verse 6. "He spake also this parable;
A certain man had a fig tree planted in
his vineyard; and he came and sought
fruit thereon, and found none. Then
said he unto the dresser of his vine-
yard, Behold, these three years I come
seeking fruit on this fig tree, and find
none: cut it down; why cumbereth it
the ground? And he answering said un-
to him, Lord, let it alone this year
also, till I shall dig about it, and dung
it: And if it bear fruit, well: and if
not, then after that thou shalt cut it
down."

Here is a parable which our Lord
gave of a man who had a fig tree planted
in his vineyard. Perhaps he had watched
the tree closely from year to year to
see if it was going to ever bear any
fruit, and each time that he came to
the vineyard there was that barren fig

tree without a sign of a fig on it. This went on for a period of time. In fact, the scriptures say three years. One day this good man decided that he had waited long enough. There was no need to look for fruit if the tree was never going to bear any. So he made a decision that day which was, no doubt, a painful decision. I wonder if it was not a little hard to decide, but he did decide and here is what he said, "Behold, these three years I come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and find none: cut it down; why cumbereth it the ground?"

You see, this tree not only failed to yield fruit, but it was occupying time and space which could be put to better use. Hence the decision was made to cut it down. I wonder if there should be some listening to the broadcast today who feel that they have wasted their lives. They have actually accomplished so very little in life.

I am reminded of the excuse which we so often hear from people who are not really giving their lives to God. In speaking of a Christian life they say, "I have tried it before. Again and again I have failed, therefore, I am not going to try it anymore until I know I can live it." Well, it is a good thing to have a firm decision that when you try it you are going to put all the effort you have into it, but the trouble is that many times people never put forth that supreme effort. In other words, they do not try as hard as they should. Then they lament their past failures and never seem to get started on the right road.

But wait a moment. I have some good news for you, friends. Listen to what the dresser of the vineyard said when this man wanted to cut his fig tree down. "And he answering said unto him, Lord, let it alone this year also, till I shall

dig about it, and dung it: And if it bear fruit, well: and if not, then after that thou shalt cut it down." You see, the dresser of the vineyard was going to give it one more chance. He was going to do his very best to get this tree to produce fruit the next season. I would like to think (although the scriptures do not say so) that the tree did produce fruit the next year.

You see, I believe that sometimes the Lord allows failures to come into our lives for a reason and a purpose. Then we accomplish more when the next opportunity comes than we could have possibly done before we realized our dependency upon God.

Therefore, let us sum it up this way. Closely examine your motives, your aspirations, and either failures or success of the past year and then use all the experience which you have gained from them to accomplish even more in the new year of 1968 which is just ahead of us. Friends, we don't know what a year may hold, but let us purpose firmly in our heart to make our decision for God and for truth and stand upon his Word even to the very end. Let us not make the same mistakes which we have made before. Neither let us lament our failures or the lost opportunities of the year which is gone to the extent that we fail to bring forth fruit for God.

Did you ever hear of the illustration of the farmer which owned the old mule and the mule fell in the well? There he was down in the bottom of the well unable to climb out. It looked as if the mule had made his last and fatal mistake. When the boys asked their father what to do about it, the farmer made one of those hard-to-make decisions. "Throw the dirt in the well and bury

the old mule." And that is just what the boys began to do. They shoveled in the dirt, but do you know what the old mule did? He shook himself, and the dirt fell beneath his feet. All the while his feet were also on the move. You can see what would happen. When the well was filled, instead of the mule being buried, he walked out of there ready to go again.

Friends, let us profit from this illustration. Let not the failures and shortcomings of the year which is past prevent us from arising and putting into action that which has been long overdue. Another chance, another year is before you. Use it to the glory of God.

I hope that God's people will hear the Macedonian call to "Come over into Macedonia and help us." Let us pray that God's word and truth may spread even more in these closing days of time. What we do for God we must do shortly. Opportunities are constantly being lost and doors in many lands are closing against the gospel. Shall we be faithful in 1968? Let us pray.

On the threshold of the passing of another year into history and the coming of a new year, our hopes and aspirations are firmly fixed in thee. Bless each one who hears the broadcast and give them the strength and courage which they need to be faithful throughout the coming year, and to thee we will give the praise through Christ our Lord. Amen
