Greetings, friends, wherever you may be hearing the sound of my voice. It is a real pleasure to be coming your way once again with a short gospel message. In thinking of the gospel, do you remember the 6th verse of the 14th chapter of Revelation which says, "And I saw another angel fly in the midst of heaven, having the everlasting gospel to preach unto them that dwell on the earth, and to every nation, and kindred, and tongue, and people"? I am particularly interested in that verse for it mentions the "everlasting gospel".

The everlasting gospel is far reaching. It has to be far reaching because of the devastating effects of sin. Sin is universal. It is known among the civilized people of the earth. Likewise it is found in the darkest jungles of heathenism. It is found among the rich and it is prevalent among the poor. There is no land or nation where people dwell that the effects of sin are not felt. Therefore the gospel of Christ is a universal gospel. It reaches just as far as sin is found. I like the old familiar hymn of Isaac Watts entitled, "Joy to the World". Listen. It says:

Joy to the world! the Lord is come;
Let earth receive her King;
Let ev'ry heart prepare Him room,
And heav'n and nature sing.

Joy to the earth! The Saviour reigns;
Let men their songs employ;
While fields and floods, Rocks, hills
and plains,
Repeat the sounding joy.

But speaking, then, of an universal sin and an universal cure, listen to this third verse.

No more let sins and sorrows grow,
Nor thorns infest the ground;
He comes to make His blessing flow
Far as the curse is found.

Friends, I love that verse. I like

that part there where it shows that his grace and blessings flow just as far as the curse is found. Surely there is no limit to the curse which has come upon the people because of their sinful condition, so the gospel reaches to the uttermost to save all who will believe.

To some it may come as a surprise to know that God is still the ruler of the universe. He sets up kingdoms and controls the affairs of the world regardless of evil men. Listen to this fourth verse.

He rules the world with truth and grace,
And makes the nations prove
The glories of His righteousness,
And wonders of his love.

And if you would like to prove his love to you in even a greater extent, you will find Him ready to forgive and save you when you come to Christ repenting of your sins.

Now the Apostle Paul in speaking of the gospel said, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek." It is not enough to have a form of religion, but you must make it a part of your life and live by it every day. The gospel will change the inner man. God is no respecter of persons, and He does not recognize age, color, or sex to discriminate against any who would come to Him. The gospel brings down the high and elevates the low. It places all on a common level.

But by the same token, we must come under the same conditions, and that is as one verse of song said, "I came to Jesus repenting, confessing my every sin. My heart's door swung

wide open, and glorious peace flowed in." That is the way you get it, friends, by coming confessing and repenting.

But there is one thing sure. You cannot serve the world and your selfish pleasures and please the Lord at the same time. You must put Him first above all. Listen to the 24th verse of the 6th chapter of Matthew. It says, "No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon."

Many people pervert the gospel by denying the power of Christ to save from sin or seeking to change the truth of the scriptures to conform to their "doctrines" of men. But God is not confined to the doctrines of men. He is universal and his gospel is universal. The Bible reads the same in every land. It is sufficient to meet every need and provides the answer to every problem.

There is only one way to be saved, and that is by repentance and faith in Christ, by partaking of the new birth. There is no shortcut; there is no bargain price. You pay a Bible price, and you will get Bible salvation. God sent only one Saviour into the world. There is salvation through no other.

Friends, let us not try to stretch the scriptures to fit a particular interpretation of them, but let us just accept the Word of God as it is written. In this day of many religions let us remember that there is one pure and true religion. The scriptures tell us about it. If we will follow the Word, the teachings of his Word, we will find the path in which He wants us to walk.

God's people make up the church

which our Lord established and He is still the king. One writer put it this way: "We reach our hands in fellowship to every blood-washed one, while love entwines about each heart in which God's will is done." Let us pray.

We ask a special blessing upon every one whose heart is open to receive the everlasting gospel of Christ. May the word spoken find an entrance into every good and honest heart, and may they in turn help to spread the everlasting gospel to the ends of the earth before the coming of our Lord, for we ask it in Jesus' name. Amen

Let me leave with you two other verses here found in the 12th chapter of Ecclesiastes, verses 13 and 14. "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man. For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be evil."

You know, in these days there are many people who do not have the fear of God before them. Many are departing from the Lord. They are giving heed to seducing spirits and doctrines of devils, and they do not fear the Lord as they should. This is one of the first things that children should be taught to do, older people as well, to fear the Lord.

Then the other part of this verse says to keep his commandments. Now the reasons we are to keep his commandments are many. First it will bring happiness and joy to our own hearts by keeping them, and then it will bring joy to the heart of God and make him pleased with our lives when we do keep his commandments. We have the warning there given that God is going to bring us into judgment with every secret thing so we need to give heed to his word and his commandments.

We hope that as this year goes on, we may be a greater blessing to others by sending forth the gospel on the radio and by the printed copies each week. Now remember this is an everlasting gospel. It is designed and intended to reach the ends of the world. This is one of the commandments that Christ left when He went away that his disciples should preach the gospel into every nation. Every place where sin is found, that is where the gospel needs to go.

We are endeavoring to help reach those places with the gospel. Even in our own land there are many who have not the love of God in their hearts. We hope that they will awaken to their need before it is everlastingly too late.

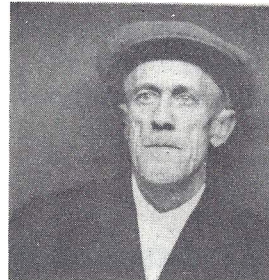


BRO. JOHN W. WILSON and his wife Sister Essie on their 25th wedding anniversary Aug. 24, 1967.
