Friends, it is a real pleasure to be coming your way with a short message from the word of God. We hope that you will stay tuned to this radio station for another broadcast of THE MISSION TRAIL from Guthrie, Oklahoma. Your speaker is Willie Murphey.

Did you know this scripture was in the Bible? In the book of James, the

4th chapter and beginning with verse 6 it says, "But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble. Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you. Cleanse your hands, ye sinners; and purify your hearts, ye double minded." You see, there are many people who have Bibles in their homes, but what we need to do is acquaint ourselves with the Bible and put into practice the things which are written therein.

First we notice here that God resists the proud. He has no fellowship with one who is stubborn and unwilling to bend his will to conform to the will of God. But we notice in verse 7 the admonition to submit yourselves therefore to God.

I once heard one of God's ministers tell how he went to pray for a person who was in trouble. If I remember correctly, I believe this individual was sick. Well, this certain preacher endeavored to encourage them to accept their circumstances in life and to be content with the conditions which they were in. But suddenly God spoke to him and said, "That is not what I told you to tell them." This startled him a little, and he began to listen further to the reasoning which God had given him, and he was reminded of the scripture which says, "Submit yourself to God." Then it was made clear that what God expects of us is to submit ourselves to His will, not to certain circumstances in life or things which we might be inclined to accept as the will of God, such as afflictions and difficulties in life.

First we should endeavor to determine what is the will of God. Now the

Bible clearly points out his will concerning us, and the Spirit of God is willing and ready to instruct us if we have a humble attitude and a willing heart. But the thing which I want to emphasize is this verse which says, "Submit yourself to God."

The poem which I read a few minutes ago indicates that the shoes on your feet would more or less insulate from the ground. There would be the leather soles and the rubber heels which would provide a good insulation from perfect contact with the Holy Ground. Even so, we should remove everything which would hinder us from coming into real close contact with the will of God.

To some, this might be their form of religion. God is not looking for a form of religion. There is too much of that already in the world today. He is looking for a genuine conversion of heart with a willingness to obey him in everything. It is not enough for us to keep part of his commandments. He wants us to submit to his perfect will. It is then and then only that we find contentment and happiness.

Just recently I had a letter from a friend in Colorado who was referring to a message which I had on the air January 14 concerning the benefits of prayer. You may remember the drawing which we had of Uncle Sam upon his knees before the altar bench.

Here is what this friend had to say about it, and I quote, ". . . I fully agree that prayer is in order anywhere, in all institutions, and I, too, would like to see Uncle Sam on his knees, and unless he turns to the Lord and obeys II Chron. 7:14, our government will continue to decline. . ." I appreciate that statement but let me read to you what II Chron. 7:14

says. "If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land." My friends, I consider this the greatest need of our country today. Each one should humble himself and seek the will of God in prayer.

Nevertheless, there is an alternative for every individual who refuses to humble himself and do the will of God. Here it is. In Romans, the 14th chapter and beginning with verse 11, it says, "For it is written, As I live, saith the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall confess to God. So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God."

Now if you want to, you can make light of that. You can try to forget it if you please. You can live in your sins and continue in a form of religion, but this is God's Word anyway.

Do you know what happened to Jerusalem after the Jews rejected Christ. Let me tell you in a very few words that that great city of renown was destroyed. It is recorded that more than one million people met their fate in that destruction of all destructions. More perished then than from any other single catastrophe of both God and man. Approximately eleven hundred thousand perished during this siege of Jerusalem by the mighty Roman empire. Some of them died of starvation, others took their own lives, while many were killed by the soldiers, and yet there were approximately 97,000 which the Roman army took as captives. The city was leveled to the ground except three towers and one wall on the west side of Jerusalem. Much of it was burned

and the foundations were dug up as to appear that no one had ever lived there. I say, it is time that each of us should submit ourselves to the will of God. Let us pray.

Our Father,

We acknowledge thee as the giver of all good gifts. We also acknowledge that thy will is supreme, and we desire thy will to be done in our lives above everything in the world. Bless each one who hears the broadcast today with a special blessing, and to thee we will give the praise through Christ our Lord. Amen

The following report comes from Sister Carrie Sheppard who is laboring for souls in Mexico. Sister Olive McFarling also presents a challenge which should awaken all of us to our duty.

"Greetings of much love to all in Jesus' lovely name. He is blessing His people! Bro. Willie, I was so very thankful for your message on prayer in The Mission Trail. That, too, is one of my callings. I surely wish to be kept on your mailing list for 1968.

"Our hearts are made to rejoice in the way the Lord is working here in Rosarito Beach, Old Mexico. It would do your heart good to see so many who attend services here and to hear the good testimonies and beautiful singing.

"Ramona Esquer Villa is a faithful worker here in the missionary work. She is very helpful to us and carries a burden for souls. We pray together often, and at times she has come with a heavy burden and asked for an agreement in prayer. Lately we have visited in many homes, reading the Word and praying with them. Nearly all seem very thankful for our visit and ask us to come again.

"On our visiting we have gained some of the members out of four families who attend services. One of these is a young girl who is a victim of polio, and she has no strength in her legs and walks with the help of crutches. Usually she is seen crawling around her neighborhood. She was happy with a color book and paints we were glad to give to her. In service she seems very interested in the Word of God, and during preaching she looks up each scripture.

"One of the women who we visit has six small children, and her husband has been placed in jail in Tijuana for six years because of his drinking. This woman buys food for her children by begging. She was in services Sunday night. She surely needs God to help

her. Four of us plan to visit her husband and others in the jail in Tijuana Sunday at noon.

"Saturday Ramona and I had 35 in the classes for children and a promise of more. This gives Ramona a chance to work with the children. Then, too, we have more time for them on Saturday.

"The Torre family are still attending another church, but during one of our visits in his home he admitted that this church he was attending had no spirit of God there. We believe he will turn to the truth. Please keep praying with us for the work here. Your Sister in Christ,"

Report on Ruth Gaines

Contrary to the wishes of Brother Clayton Gaines and his wife Eva Lou, their six-year old daughter Ruth who has been seriously ill has been taken by county and state officials and put in the state hospital at Columbia, Mo. Sister Eva Lou in writing to a close personal friend had this to say: "They took her to surgery last Tuesday to take brain tests and to remove the tumor but they found that they couldn't remove the tumor because it was too near the base of the brain, and to remove the tumor would be sure death. . . They inserted a tube in her neck and head to relieve the pressure. Now they plan to give radiation treatments to treat the tumor, but that sounds like a temporary relief. . . So we know not just what the Lord has in mind, but I believe he is working. We are expecting the Lord to glorify His name. Our only fear is that we be careful that we not fail Him in any way. We are trying to walk carefully so that the Lord can work. We feel the Lord has had a purpose in this although we know not what, so we're just trusting. Clayton and I are feeling all right now. . . She is partially paralyzed on her left side. Her throat is paralyzed and part of her face, I think. . . Ruth cannot talk at all. . . We want the saints to come if they wish to come, but you might not get to see Ruth even if you came, and we aren't thinking the saints are letting us down if they don't come because we know they are concerned about us and are praying for us. 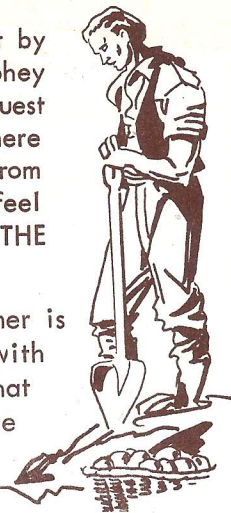
