A Blessing and a Curse

Jesus Satisfies

There is a scripture in the 11th chapter of Deuteronomy and beginning with verse 26 which tells how God sets before each of us a blessing and a curse. It is up to us which one we will choose. I like to think of us having the opportunity to choose for ourselves the course in life which we will pursue.

Listen as I give these words from the scriptures to you. "Behold, I set before you this day a blessing and a curse; A blessing, if ye obey the commandments of the Lord your God, which I command you this day: And a curse, if ye will not obey the commandments of the Lord your God, but turn aside out of the way which I command you this day, to go after other gods, which ye have not known.

Now the blessings described here are promised only to those who obey. In other words, it is the righteous who are going to receive the blessing. Therefore, we should learn what is required of each of us to be righteous. John speaks of it right here in 1 John the 3rd chapter and verses 7 and 8. "Little children, let no man deceive you: he that doeth righteousness is righteous, even as he is righteous. He that committeth sin is of the devil; for the devil sinneth from the beginning. For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that he might destroy the works of the devil." Now I believe

that is plain. In other words, a righteous person is one who does not commit sin. Does that seem too strong? Well it is not too strong according to these scriptures. In fact, the same thing is brought out in Romans the 6th chapter and verse 18. "Being then made free from sin, ye became the servants of righteousness."

A righteous person then is one whose sins are forgiven. They are covered by the atoning blood of Christ our Saviour. Here it is again in Romans the 4th chapter and verses 7 and 8. "Saying, Blessed are they whose iniquities are forgiven, and whose sins are covered. Blessed is the man to whom the Lord will not impute sin."

Let me show you the blessings which are going to accompany such a life. Deuteronomy 28 and beginning with verse 1 describes the state and condition of a nation who fears God. Here it is.

"And it shall come to pass, if thou shalt hearken diligently unto the voice of the Lord thy God, to observe and to do all his commandments which I command thee this day, that the Lord thy God will set thee on high above all nations of the earth: And all these blessings shall come on thee, and overtake thee, if thou shalt hearken unto the voice of the Lord thy God.

"Blessed shalt thou be in the city, and blessed shalt thou be in the field. Blessed shall be the fruit of thy body, and the fruit of thy ground, and the fruit of thy cattle, the increase of thy kine, and the flocks of thy sheep. Blessed shall be thy basket and thy store. Blessed shalt thou be when thou comest in, and blessed shalt thou be when thou goest out.

"The Lord shall cause thine enemies that rise up against thee to be smitten before thy face: they shall come out against thee one way, and flee before thee seven ways. The Lord shall command the blessing upon thee in thy storehouses, and in all that thou settest thine hand unto; and he shall bless thee in the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee. The Lord shall establish thee an holy people unto himself, as he hath sworn unto thee, if thou shalt keep the commandments of the Lord thy God, and walk in his ways.

"And all people of the earth shall see that thou art called by the name of the Lord; and they shall be afraid of thee. And the Lord shall make thee plenteous in goods, in the fruit of thy body, and in the fruit of thy cattle, and in the fruit of thy ground, in the land which the Lord sware unto thy fathers to give thee. The Lord shall open unto thee his good treasure, the heaven to give the rain unto thy land in his season, and to bless all the work of thine hand: and thou shalt lend unto many nations, and thou shalt not borrow.

"And the Lord shall make thee the head, and not the tail; and thou shalt be above only, and thou shalt not be beneath; if that thou hearken unto the commandments of the Lord thy God, which I command thee this day, to observe and to do them: And thou shalt not go aside from any of the words which I command thee this day, to the right hand, or to the left, to go after other gods to serve them."

I would say then that there are enough blessings described in that scripture to cause every nation under heaven to want to be a righteous one. In fact, the righteous people are blessed with a hope which goes beyond the tomb.

They are blessed in keeping the commandments of God. They also receive a blessing making them financially able and willing to give of their earthly substance to those who are in need. Don't you remember the scripture which says, "It is more blessed to give than to receive."

We also find in Revelation that "Blessed and holy is he that hath part in the first resurrection." Do you know when the first resurrection takes place? It is when you have been resurrected from a dead state of sin to live a new life in Christ Jesus right here in this world. Isn't that what the scriptures say? "And you hath he quickened who were dead in trespasses and sin." All of these blessings, of course, come through faith in a resurrected Saviour.

And then we do have hope in the resurrection morning when all the dead shall be raised to meet the Lord. Certainly this is a wonderful hope that we as the children of God have in Christ.

But, my friends, I want to point out to you today that for the wicked there is only a curse. Daniel 12:10 says, "Many shall be purified, and made white, and tried; but the wicked shall do wickedly: and none of the wicked shall understand; but the wise shall understand."

Now just as Deuteronomy promises a blessing for the righteous, it also describes the curse which shall come upon the wicked. Here it is in the 28th chapter, beginning with verse 15.

"But it shall come to pass, if thou wilt not hearken unto the voice of the Lord thy God, to observe to do all his commandments and his statutes which I command thee this day; that all these

curse shall come upon thee, and overtake thee:

"Cursed shalt thou be in the city, and cursed shalt thou be in the field. Cursed shall be thy basket and thy store. Cursed shall be the fruit of thy body, and the fruit of thy land, the increase of thy kine, and the flocks of thy sheep. Cursed shalt thou be when thou comest in, and cursed shalt thou be when thou goest out.

"The Lord shall send upon thee cursing, vexation, and rebuke, in all that thou settest thine hand unto for to do, until thou be destroyed, and until thou perish quickly; because of the wickedness of thy doings, whereby thou hast forsaken me."

Friends, I'll tell you what we need in our cities and our country today. We need a return unto the things of God--a repenting and a turning away from the evil and the curses which are coming upon us. Surely God will notice and spare us from them when we turn unto Him. Let us pray.

Our Father,

We are glad for the promise of thy blessings upon the righteous. These are the things which we are seeking for today. Bless each one who hears the broadcast and may they so live that thou wilt not hesitate to give them of thy very richest blessings, and to thee we will give the praise through Christ our Lord. Amen

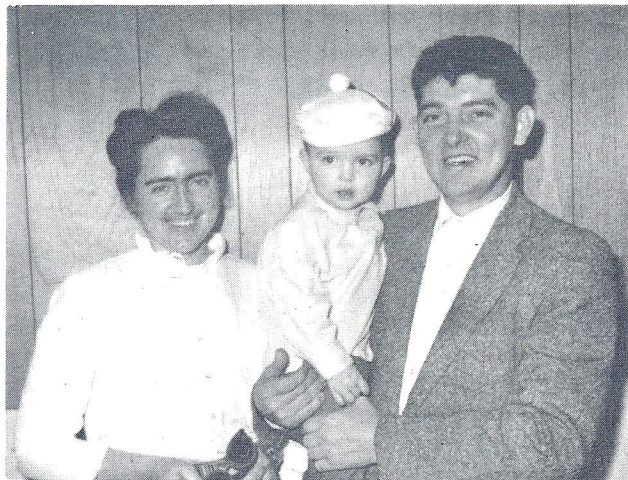
