## "He Thought Within Himself"

Radio Broadcast for week of May 12, 1968 (See back page for list of stations)

. . . Friends, it gives me pleasure to be coming your way once again by means of radio with a short message from the Word of God. I hope you will stay tuned to this station for I believe I have something that will be both interesting and helpful to you. Not long ago while sitting in the Sunday School class and listening to the scripture reading and the discussion, I received an inspiration for this message. So without further introduction here is the scripture reading.

"Why should it be thought a thing incredible with you, that God should raise the dead? I verily thought with myself, that I ought to do many things contrary to the name of Jesus of Nazareth. Which thing I also did in Jerusalem: and many of the saints did I shut up in prison, having received authority from the chief priests; and when they were put to death, I gave my voice against them. And I punished them oft in every synagogue, and compelled them to blaspheme; and being exceedingly mad against them, I persecuted them even unto strange cities." Acts 26:8-11.

This is the testimony of the Apostle Paul. He told how he had thought within himself to persecute the church and the Lord's people. But here is what I want you to notice. "I verily thought with myself." I would say that God was not pleased at all with his thoughts. They were contrary to the ways and thoughts of God. How often this is true, friends. Men often think within themselves certain things which are not right at all.

Here is another example.

"And he spoke a parable unto them, saying, The ground of a certain rich man brought forth plentifully: And he thought within himself, saying, What shall I do, because I have no room where to bestow my fruits? And he said, This will I do: I will pull down my barns, and build greater; and there will I bestow all my fruits and my goods. And I will say to my soul, Soul, thou hast much goods laid up for many years; take thine ease, eat, drink, and be merry.

"But God said unto him, Thou fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee: then whose shall those things be, which thou hast provided? So is he that layeth up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God." Luke 12:16-21.

Do you see what happened to that rich man who "thought within himself"? He thought he was going to live to enjoy the many fruits and goods which his ground had produced, but he was mistaken. He was not thinking correctly. His life was taken and he was called to give account for his soul.



Listen to what Isaiah 65:2 says about this: "I have spread out my hands all the day unto a rebellious people, which walketh in a way that was not good, after their own thoughts."

And again in Psalms 10:4-7: "The wicked, through the pride of his countenance, will not seek after God: God is not in all his thoughts. His ways are always grievous; thy judgments are far above out of his sight: as for all his enemies, he puffeth at them. He hath said in his heart, I shall not be moved: for I shall never be in adversity. His mouth is full of cursing and deceit and fraud: under his tongue is mischief and vanity."

Now even before the flood, men's thoughts went astray from God. Listen to this verse. "And God saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually." Genesis 6:5.

Let me explain that men in their natural state are filled with their own ways and are not willing to accept the ways of God. Here is another scripture. "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts. Isaiah 55:8-9.

Here is further proof of it. I quote again. "For they know not the thoughts of the Lord, neither understand they his counsel: for he shall gather them as the sheaves into the floor." Micah 4:12. But examples are sometimes worth more than just words. So I want to give three examples. Here they are. First I refer you to Haman that wicked

man who schemed to put to death many innocent people. But let me show you how he was mistaken in his thinking. I quote.

"So Haman came in. And the king said unto him, What shall be done unto the man whom the king delighteth to honour? Now Haman thought in his heart, To whom would the king delight to do honour more than to myself?" Esther 6:6.

You see, Haman thought he was going to be honored, but he was mistaken. It was his enemy Mordecai a godly man whom the king chose to honor. Nevertheless, Haman had the honor to lead the horse through the streets and announce that Mordecai was being honored at the command of Ahasuerus. However, this did not bring him much delight for he would much rather have been riding in the seat of honor.

Here is another example. I quote from Daniel 4, beginning with verse 4. "I Nebuchadnezzar was at rest in mine house, and flourishing in my palace: I saw a dream which made me afraid, and the thoughts upon my bed and the visions of my head troubled me."

Now Nebuchadnezzar was a great king, and God had permitted him to have much honor. But look, his thoughts began to trouble him. And I guess he had a right to be troubled for his kingdom was taken from him, and he ate grass like the oxen for seven years until he learned that God ruled in the kingdoms of men and gave them to whomsoever He will. Nebuchadnezzar had become lifted up and proud. But when he acknowledged that power and might which came from the hands of the Almighty, he was again permitted to return to his throne.



My next example is that of Belshazzar. Do you remember the king who blasphemed the things of God and drank wine from the golden vessels of the Lord? Do you remember the writing on the wall which the magicians could not read? But listen.

"Then the king's countenance was changed, and his thoughts troubled him, so that the joints of his loins were loosed, and his knees smote one against another." Daniel 5:6. Yes, I agree. I can well see why his thoughts troubled him. He failed to find an answer within himself. He sought for the wisdom of God. This was found in Daniel.

Here is another time when a person's thoughts troubled him. I quote. "And the second time the cock crew. And Peter called to mind the word that Jesus said unto him, Before the cock crow twice, thou shalt deny me thrice. And when he thought thereon, he wept." Mark 14:72. Peter found relief from his failure by repenting.

You see, our thoughts are fully known to God anyway. Listen. "O Lord, thou hast searched me, and known me. Thou knowest my downsitting and mine uprising, thou understandest my thought afar off." And again: "For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any two edged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart." Hebrews 4:12.

And then this final scripture of hope. "For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the Lord, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end. Then shall ye call upon me, and ye shall go and pray unto

me, and I will harken unto you. And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart." Jeremiah 29:11-13.

Friends, let me offer this bit of advice to one and all--drop our own personal thoughts. Let us each one do this and accept the thoughts of God. It is not within our own ability to direct our lives, but we need God's thoughts, God's guidance, and God's holy spirit to lead us in the way which goes from earth to glory. Let us not walk after the lusts of the flesh and after the will of men, but let us be transformed through the renewing of our minds that we may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God. Let us pray.

Our Father,

It is with a sense of humility that we come before thee, the all-wise and powerful creator of all. Bless the words of the message to every heart in Jesus' name, and to thee we will give the praise forever. Amen
