The Promised Messiah - - Part 3

Radio Broadcast for week of December 28, 1969 (See back page for list of stations.)

A very cheerful good morning to each and every listener of the broadcast. I am very happy to be coming your way once again with the everlasting gospel of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. This is now the 3rd week which I am continuing with the subject of "The promised Messiah". We have considered the prophecies of his coming and we have seen the fulfillment given in the scriptures and for this time I want to consider the object of his coming, or we might say the purpose of his coming. Now really, dear ones, just for what purpose did Jesus come? And did he fulfill that purpose? Was it a successful mission? And did he carry out his father's plan and fulfill the purpose of his coming?

To begin with then listen to this scripture. It is a prophecy from Daniel 2: 44, "And in the days of these kings shall the God of heaven set up a kingdom, which shall never be destroyed: and the kingdom shall not be left to other people, but it shall break in pieces and consume all these kingdoms, and it shall stand for ever." This scripture is dealing with the dream which Nebuchadnezzar had and the prophet Daniel interpreted it for him. Read it for yourself and get the full connection from the second chapter of Daniel. But let us hasten on. Most Bible students who are familiar with prophecy will immediately recognize that we are dealing with 5 universal kingdoms. Now there may be some disagreement as to just how these all apply. But notice very carefully, Babylonian, Medo-Persian, Grecian, Roman, and the everlasting kingdom of God. Rome was the last universal kingdom among earthly kingdoms. She was in the height of her glory when Christ appeared and established the everlasting kingdom of

God. "In the days of these kings (kingdoms)," or that is during the reign of these four kings, the God of heaven was to set up his everlasting kingdom.

Here then are some of the objects of his coming.

1. To establish a kingdom.

Fulfillment: And I quote, "Now after that John was put in prison, Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God". Mark 1:14 Here is another scripture. "The law and the prophets were until John: since that time the kingdom of God is preached, and every man presseth into it." Luke 16:16 And then this one, "Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son". Col. 1: 13 Dear ones, I say that Christ was successful in establishing his kingdom and we, who are saved from our sins, are enjoying the glory of it right now. I am glad to be in that kingdom, aren't

you? It is a kingdom of peace, as the song says, it shall ever increase.

It is a kingdom which the God of heaven set up. That this means the whole dispensation of the gospel and the moral effects produced by it in the souls of men and in the world needs little proof. The kingdom of God and the kingdom of heaven is a kingdom not of this world, not raised by human ambition, the lust of rule, or military conquest, but a spiritual kingdom raised and maintained by the grace of God himself in which he himself lives and rules, governing by his own spirit, producing not wars and contentions but glory to God in the highest and on earth peace and good will among men. The kingdom of God, says the apostle, is righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost. Rom. 14:17 It is righteousness without any sin, peace without inward disturbance and joy without mental unhappiness. How can we conceive of any thing higher or more excellent than this? This kingdom shall never be destroyed. It is the everlasting gospel and the work of the everlasting God. As it neither originates in, nor is dependent on the passions of men, it cannot be destroyed. All other governments from the imperfection of their nature contain in them the seeds of their own destruction. Kings die, ministers change, subjects are not permanent, new relations arise and with them new measures, new passions, and new projects. And these produce political changes and often political ruin. But this government being the government of God cannot be affected by the changes and chances to which mortal things are exposed. The kingdom of God shall not be left to other people.

Notice then, the next purpose or object of his coming.

2. To give rest to the Gentiles. Here is the prophecy in Isa. 11:10, "And in that day there shall be a root of Jesse, which shall stand for an ensign of the people; to it shall the Gentiles seek: and his rest shall be glorious." Notice particularly that this says the Gentiles are going to seek unto him. So it includes more than just Jews.

Then here is the fulfillment in Acts 13: 46-48, "Then Paul and Barnabas waxed bold, and said, It was necessary that the word of God should first have been spoken to you: but seeing ye put it from you, and judge yourselves unworthy of everlasting life, lo, we turn to the Gentiles. For so hath the Lord commanded us, saying, I have set thee to be a light of the Gentiles, that thou shouldest be for salvation unto the ends of the earth. And when the Gentiles heard this, they were glad, and glorified the word of the Lord: and as many as were ordained to eternal life believed."

I am going to share with you a letter which really sounds out a note of victory: This letter comes from Ohio:

"Dear ones in Christ,

"So good once again to send greetings of divine love in Jesus precious name.

"It was a great blessing to receive The Mission Trail, your good letter, and the beautiful card this morning.

"No wonder the angels said, Glory to God in the Highest and on earth peace, good will toward men. St. Luke 2:14 For the greatest gift ever given to mankind was laid yonder in Bethlehem's manger over 1900 years ago.

"I am so thankful today for the wonderful plan of salvation. I can truly say

from the depths of my soul Jesus is all the world to me, my life, my joy, my all, my dearest friend from day to day. For without Him I would fall. My strength, my rock, my high tower, Praise His dear name! I do thank the Lord this morning for victory in my soul. I have no other desire but to keep pressing on in the service of the Lord. The prayer of my heart each day is to live closer to God and be a greater blessing to every one I come in contact with.

"So many are lost and so few seem to care. I am burdened for souls. I pray God will deepen my burden.

"There is such a great need for Holy Ghost filled ministers. . . I am isolated and don't get to be in church very often. But I do thank God for the privilege of prayer and His precious Word. That is a light unto my pathway and a lamp unto my feet. . . I know that God still hears and answers prayer. His ear is not heavy that he cannot hear. Isa. 59:1b

"For He is the Lord our God; who healeth all our diseases. Psalms 103:3b

"Enclosed is a small offering for the Lord's work.

"Pray for me that I will keep humble, meek, and lowly at the feet of Jesus. That I will be a greater worker in His vineyard in the days to come, than I have ever been before. Praying for the saints everywhere.

"Christian love and prayers, Sadie Stamm"

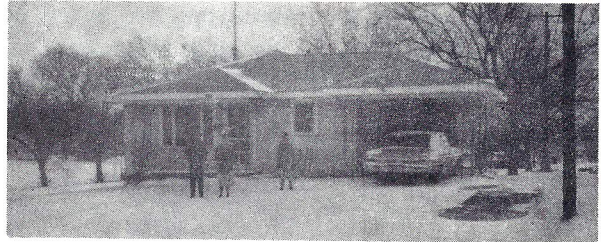
LEMUEL
