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## The Power of God

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Good morning. It's a pleasure to be coming your way once again with the gospel. This is THE MISSION TRAIL broadcast and your speaker is Willie Murphey. Today I want to speak about something which is important to all of us. It is the power of God. We understand that through faith the worlds were framed and we know that God has all power. There is nothing too hard for God. The things which are impossible with men are no struggle at all for the Lord to do. But we, as his people, need to be able to draw on the resources of God, and have a portion of that power within our own lives.

Jesus in speaking to his disciples just before he returned to his father had this to say, "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth." Acts 1:8 What we need today is more of the power of God. Power is that which causes things to move. It is active. It is forceful and will make us overcomers. This is what we need in our lives to cause us to be active for the Lord, and to be soul winners for him, and let the world know where we stand and what we believe, when it comes to the truth of God's word. Have you this power in your life? I am not speaking about one's own personal power, because this is limited. If God doesn't extend his grace to them, to us, we could do nothing. We want our power to come from God. Listen to this verse from Deut. 8:18, "But thou shalt remember the Lord thy God: for it is he that giveth thee power to get wealth, that he may establish his cov-

enant which he sware unto thy fathers, as it is this day." If God were to withdraw his mercy, we would have no power at all.

During the trial of Christ our Lord he was brought before Pilate. He was accused, mocked, and spit upon. They put a purple robe upon him, plaited a crown of thorns, put it upon his head and they mocked him and said 'Hail, King of the Jews'. But Pilate wanted to hear Jesus speak for himself. He was concerned. He wanted to know just what this man of Galilee would have to say and when Jesus didn't speak enough to satisfy him, here is what Pilate said, "Then saith Pilate unto him, Speakest thou not unto me? knowest thou not that I have power to crucify thee, and have power to release thee?" John 19:10 But going a little further with the scripture look at the reply which Jesus said, Have you ever heard words that had such meaning? Jesus answered, Thou couldst have no power at all against me, except it were given thee from above: therefore he that

delivered me unto thee hath the greater sin." Let us remember that Christ had power over death and over hell. His power was manifest to heal all those that were oppressed of the enemy and were afflicted when they came to him. This power was given unto him and it had been shown unto the world. The lame had been made to walk, the dumb to speak, the deaf to hear, and the blind eyes had been opened. He put to shame the Pharisees who were hypocritical and professed to love God but in works they denied him.

One of the best examples of power which is seen in our day is the electrical power generated for home use and in the shops and industries. How quickly we notice when the power is gone from the electrical circuits. Here is a typical example given in a letter which I recently received from Sis. Beatrice Spaur who attended the assembly meeting in Pacoima, Calif.:

'Another experience we had--the ordiance service was so precious, such a wonderful message. As the minister was dismissing the assembly the lights went out just as he said amen. We were in darkness. We found out later an airplane had gotten tangled in the lines and broke the wires; was quite an area in darkness. The saints had some candles, put them up in pulpit, made me think of the dark ages when God's children met in caves to worship the Lord. I am sure they had but little light, but they had the light of God in their hearts. The saints continued to sing and oh, such beautiful singing, one song after another. The lights were off at least two hours or more, looked like if the minister preached it would be by candle light and they were burning down. I believe Bro. Chandler got up and went to the pulpit. The saints

were singing, 'Lord, sent the power down' and as they sang the lights came on. Then the shouting started. It was a real outpouring of the Spirit. Some stood up shouting the praises of God. Yes, the Church of God is still moving on, praise the Lord!' End of quote

Well, thank the Lord for the power he gives his children over all the power of the enemy. We hope you have that victory today in your lives and if you don't, you surely should be seeking for it.

David in praising the Lord puts it this way, "Wherefore David blessed the Lord before all the congregation: and David said, Blessed be thou, Lord God of Israel our father, for ever and ever. Thine, O Lord, is the greatness, and the power, and the glory, and the victory, and the majesty: for all that is in the heaven and in the earth is thine; thine is the kingdom, O Lord, and thou are exalted as head above all. Both riches and honour come of thee, and thou reignest over all; and in thine hand is power and might; and in thine hand it is to make great, and to give strength unto all. Now therefore, our God, we thank thee, and praise thy glorious name." I Chron. 29:10-13 And in the Psalms 62:11 we find these words, "God hath spoken once; twice have I heard this; that power belongeth unto God." There is power in the name of Christ. There is power in prayer to move and lift the heavy burdens. There is power to transform a life of sin into one of righteousness. Jesus likened the new birth, when he was speaking to Nicodemus, unto the wind blowing. It couldn't be seen, but the results of it were much in evidence and so it is with God's power. There is plenty of it to meet all of our needs, if we can just place ourselves in a position to receive

it from him. In Isa. 40:29 we read these words, "He giveth power to the faint; and to them that have no might he increaseth strength." Then in Eph. 1:19, "And what is the exceeding greatness of his power to us-ward who believe, according to the working of his mighty power".

But let me show you another thing. There are some folks whose experience is just like this scripture says in II Tim. 3 and beginning with the first verse, "This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come. For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, Without natural affection, trucebreakers, false accusers, incontinent, fierce, despisers of those that are good, Traitors, heady, highminded, lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God; Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away." Denying what power? Denying God the power to transform their lives, to change their hearts from a heart of stone, to one upon which he will write his laws and his commandments. They deny God the power to rule and reign in their life, seeking rather their own sinful pleasures. Now from these the scripture says to turn away.

Let us pray,

Our Father,

We are aware that all power is given into thy hands, and that the God who created the world, the universe, and the stars of heaven is able to help us in the time of need. We are so glad that thou art mindful of your own children. Give us the power to live daily above sin and free from condemnation in the light of God. Bless each listener

of the broadcast today with salvation, healing and deliverance and to thee we will give the praise through Christ our Lord. Amen
