Let God Lead

Radio Broadcast for week of February 7, 1971 (See back page for list of stations.)

"Now it came to pass, as they went, that he entered into a certain village: and a certain woman named Martha received him into her house. And she had a sister called Mary, which also sat at Jesus' feet, and heard his word. But Martha was cumbered about much serving, and came to him, and said, Lord, dost thou not care that my sister hath left me to serve alone? bid her therefore that she help me. And Jesus answered and said unto her, Martha, Martha, thou art careful and troubled about many things: But one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her. " Luke 10:38-42

Good morning, friends. It is surely a great privilege that I have to come your way another time by means of radio. We are glad to be an ambassador We want to be a good for the Lord. representative for him. I hope today finds you well and encouraged in the Lord and that you are finding his ways precious to your soul.

In choosing a caption for this message I think I will just call it "Let God lead". Did you ever hear the expression "Doit-yourself"? There are some people like that, the "do-it-yourself" kind. Well, that is fine up to a certain point. It really takes people who are willing to be up and doing to accomplish very much. But there is another very important factor which we should not over-That is the leadership of the look. Holy Spirit in whatever we endeavor to do for God's cause. Unless the Lord leads, all of our efforts will amount to very little. Listen to this scripture from Psa. 127:1, "Except the Lord build the house, they labor in vain that build it: except the Lord keep the city,

the watchman waketh but in vain. " Can't you see how dependent we are upon the Lord? It may be all right to be a "doit-yourself" person, but unless God is in it, it will accomplish little as far as eternal value goes.

Back in the early days of the church God was working miracles through the apostles but the high priest along with the Sadduces, that is some of them, were filled with indignation. did they do? They laid hands on the apostles and they had them cast into prison. But the angel of the Lord was right there. You can read about it in the 5th chapter of Acts. So we read that the angel opened up the prison doors by night and brought the disciples out with the instruction to "Go, stand and speak in the temple to the people all the words of this life. " All right, that is what they did. So the next morning the high priest and those that were with him called the council together and they were really disturbed. looked like things were getting out of hand. Here they had the apostles put

in prison, but the Lord had let them out, and they were teaching the people again. It just seemed as if they were not going to be able to stop them.

Well, there was one fellow, he was a Pharisee and a doctor of the law, whose name was Gamaliel. Now this fellow had quite a bit of understanding. So he instructed the people to be careful what they were doing. He reminded them how other people rose up and drew away disciples after themselves, but their work came to nought. So he finished up with words like these, "And now I say unto you, Refrain from these men, and let them alone: for if this counsel or this work be of men, it will come to nought: But if it be of God, ye cannot overthrow it; lest haply ye be found even to fight against God. " Now this doctor of the law was pretty smart in this situation. He realized that if God was not in this work which the disciples were doing, it would come to nought. But if God was in it, the people couldn't stop it if they tried. Haven't you found things this way in your life. If God is leading, there is not enough power on earth or in hell to stop the working of the Spirit. But if God isn't in a thing, we may as well not do it anyway.

Before I get too far away from my original scripture I want to remind you that I believe Martha was a devoted sincere servant of the Lord. She was looking out for his welfare. She was preparing something for him to eat, but she was busy, busy, busy. In fact, she was so busy that she didn't have time to sit down and listen to the words of the Lord. Don't you think it would have been better if both Mary and Martha would have listened to the words of the Lord? They could have enjoyed the things of God together. I believe

that Martha missed a great blessing by not taking time to visit with Jesus. Well, really Jesus somewhat reproved her anyway for being so busy.

In speaking of this "do-it-yourself" type of person, remember what Saul did? Saul was the King of Israel. They were having problems with the Philistines, so the prophet Samuel appointed a certain time to come to Gilgal. I suppose he was going to make an offering and would have perhaps strengthened Saul's position with the people. Well, Samuel didn't show up just when Saul thought he should. So what did he do? He got tired of waiting, "And Saul said, Bring hither a burnt offering to me, and peace offerings. And he offered the burnt offering." I Sam. 13:9 You see he was going to do it himself. Well, he did, but God wasn't in it. away after he offered the sacrifice, Samuel came. Samuel asked him what he had done. Saul explained that the people were scattered from him and Samuel hadn't showed up when he was So he just went ahead supposed to. with the offering. Notice how he said it, "I forced myself therefore, and offered a burnt offering." I guess he did force himself. The Lord didn't Do you suppose force him to do it. there are people today that are forcing themselves to do things that God is not in? I am convinced of it. Listen here, "But Samuel said to Saul, Thou hast done foolishly: thou hast not kept the commandment of the Lord thy God, which he commanded thee: for now would the Lord have established thy kingdom upon Israel for ever. But now thy kingdom shall not continue: Lord hath sought him a man after his own heart, and the Lord hath commanded him to be captain over his people, because thou hast not kept that which the Lord commanded thee."

Remember this: Christ set up his kingdom. He selected his disciples and left the work of God with them when he ascended to his father. Jesus Christ is the chief cornerstone and the foundation of the building. I Cor. 3:11 puts it this way, "For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ." Now, we as members of Christ's body are workers together in this building of God. Listen to this poem:

Cumbered About Much Serving Christ never asks of us such heavy labor

As leaves no time for resting at his feet;

The waiting attitude of expectation He ofttimes counts a service most complete.

He sometimes wants our ear, our rapt attention,

That he some sweetest secret may impart:

'Tis always in the time of deepest stillness

That heart finds deepest fellowship with heart.

We sometimes wonder why our Lord doth place us

Within a sphere so narrow, so obscure, That nothing we call work can find an entrance;

There's only room to suffer--to endure!

Well, God loves patience! Souls that dwell in stillness,

Doing the little things or resting quite, May just as perfectly fulfill their mission.

Be just as useful in the Father's sight.

As they who grapple with some giant evil.

Clearing a path that every eye may see: Our Saviour cares for cheerful acquiescence,

Rather than for a busy ministry.

And yet he does love service when 'tis given

By grateful love that clothes itself in deed;

But work that's done beneath the scourge of duty--

Be sure, to such he gives but little heed.

Then seek to please him, whatsoe'er he bids thee,

Whether to do, to suffer, or lie still; 'Twill matter little by what path he led us,

If in it all we sought to do his will.

Let us pray, Our gracious Father,

We ask that the spirit of God may bear the words of the message to the hearts of the listeners and the readers of the Mission Trail. Bless each one in the way which they need most; strengthen the weak, heal the sick, and encourage all those who have a love for the truth, and thine shall be the praise through Christ our Lord. Amen


