The Resurrection!

Radio Broadcast for week of April 11, 1971 (See back page for list of stations.)

Good morning, friends. How are you on this Easter morning? Enjoying the victory brought to you through Christ, I hope. It is surely a pleasure to be coming your way by means of radio. I hope this message will reach into the presence of many of those who may be driving their automobiles on the highways and that it will also go behind the locked doors into thousands of homes. Not only that but I hope it will enter into the hearts of those who hear the gospel.

There is so much good scripture which I could read you but I am reluctant to take up too much of the time just reading the scriptures to you, although they are so good. But when you have time why don't you turn over to the 4th chapter of Romans. Yes, and you might just go on and read the 5th chapter too. But in this 4th chapter it is telling about Abraham and how he did not stagger at the promises of God. Notice these words beginning with verse 22, "And therefore it was imputed to him for righteousness. Now it was not written for his sake alone, that it was imputed to him; But for us also, to whom it shall be imputed, if we believe on him that raised up Jesus our Lord from the dead; Who was delivered for our offences, and was raised again for our justification." Please notice that there was a purpose in the resurrection of Jesus. He was raised for our justification. In other words, our righteousness comes through the atonement of the suffering, death, burial, and resurrection of our Lord. It took it all to make the plan of salvation complete. Aren't you glad that Jesus drank from that cup? He was not only divine but

he was also human. He would like to have avoided the cup of suffering and death, but it was plainly the will of his father. Listen to this poem:

BEFORE THE CROSS

Sweet the moments, rich in blessing,
Which before the cross I spend,
Life and health and peace possessing,
From the sinner's dying Friend.

Love and grief my heart dividing,
With my tears his feet I'll bathe;
Constant still, in faith abiding,
Life deriving from his death.

Truly blessed is this station,
Low before his cross to lie,
While I see divine compassion
Beaming in his gracious eye.

Here I'll sit--forever viewing
Mercy streaming in his blood;
Precious drops, my soul bedewing,
Plead and claim my peace with God.

Here it is I find my heaven,
While upon the cross I gaze;
Love I much? I'm more forgiven--
I'm a miracle of grace.

May I still enjoy this feeling,
 In all need to Jesus go;
 Prove his wounds each day more
 healing,
 And himself more fully know.

Friends, did you ever stop to ask yourself "Where would we be today if there had been no Calvary?" If there had been no death of our saviour, if there had been no burial and no resurrection, where would we be? Where would the world be? Well, really the world is in bad enough condition as it is but I would say that it would be in a much worse condition had there been no plan of salvation.

Please listen carefully to this scripture from Exodus 32 and beginning with verse 30, "And it came to pass on the morrow, that Moses said unto the people, Ye have sinned a great sin: and now I will go up unto the Lord; peradventure I shall make an atonement for your sin. And Moses returned unto the Lord, and said, Oh, this people have sinned a great sin, and have made them gods of gold. Yet now, if thou wilt forgive their sin--; and if not, blot me, I pray thee, out of thy book which thou hast written. And the Lord said unto Moses, Whosoever hath sinned against me, him will I blot out of my book."

I am especially impressed with the way Moses presented this case to the Lord. He told the people "peradventure I shall make an atonement for your sin." That "peradventure" means that maybe he would and maybe he would not make an atonement for their sin. It seemed to depend upon whether or not the Lord would accept the people and forgive them. I notice here in verse 32 that Moses said, "Yet now, if thou wilt forgive their sin--;" Here Moses seems to leave an unfinished sentence. He

didn't know what would happen. He didn't know what to expect. This request to forgive their sins just seems to be broken off with an uncertain feeling, although he did ask the Lord to blot out his name if he refused to forgive the people of their sins. In giving you this I especially want you to consider this word "peradventure".

Then think of this: Peradventure--or "what if"--there had been no saviour? Peradventure Christ would have refused to suffer and die for our sins, then where would we be? You see, although the life of Christ was taken from him yet he willingly laid it down, or in other words, he gave it. What if he had refused to do so? Then where would that leave us? Well, I'll tell you frankly, dear ones, it would have left us in a bad condition.

But think of this for a moment. What if there had been no resurrection? Do you know where we would be. I think I can tell you right here from the scriptures. Listen to this from I Cor. 15 and beginning with verse 13, "But if there be no resurrection of the dead, then is Christ not risen: And if Christ be not risen, then is our preaching vain, and your faith is also vain. Yea, and we are found false witnesses of God; because we have testified of God that he raised up Christ: whom he raised not up, if so be that the dead rise not. For if the dead rise not, then is not Christ raised: And if Christ be not raised, your faith is vain; ye are yet in your sins." So to me it seems that this would indeed be a dismal world were there no hope of a resurrection. Aren't you glad indeed that Christ has risen? I am. It means something to me. I am looking forward to the time when I shall indeed look upon the face of a risen Christ. Won't that be a thrill?

Just to know that we can see him, the one who suffered, died, and rose again. No wonder we are told, "And that he died for all, that they which live should not henceforth live unto themselves, but unto him which died for them, and rose again." II Cor. 5:15

Friends, I'll tell you what let's do. Let us just leave the "if" out of this! Christ has done his part. He has finished his mission in this world. Now it is up to you and to me to be faithful to do our part even unto the end. Are you willing to do that?

Let us pray,

Our Father,

Bless the words of the message today. We are so glad for a resurrected Christ, the one who has the keys to death and hell, who came forth victorious from the tomb even as it was guarded by the Roman soldiers. Bless each listener of the broadcast in the way which they need most and to thee we will give the praise through Christ our Lord. Amen

Thank you so much for taking time to listen. We surely appreciate those who help us keep the message on the air from week to week.
