Present Salvation

Radio Broadcast for week of July 4, 1971 (See back page for list of stations.)

Good morning, friends. I hope you are enjoying the blessings of the Lord during these warm summer days. We are reminded that the campmeeting season is here again. Let me tell you what I want to do. I want to take just a few seconds of time to give to each and every one of you who listen to this broadcast a special invitation to attend the national campmeeting of the Church of God in Missouri beginning July 23 continuing through August 1. This will be under the big tabernacle about 5 miles east of Neosho in the community known as Monark Springs. Be sure to come. It will be possible for you to meet saints there who live all over the country. There you can hear the truth as it goes forth from Mt. Zion by God's ministers as they are moved by the Holy Spirit. Listen to this song, "Glorious Peace" which was sung there in an earlier campmeeting.

Doesn't that make you want to be in another good campmeeting?

Friends, here is a scripture for you and it is found in the 2nd chapter of Titus and the 11th and 12th verses. Listen, "For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men, Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world. There are several things worth noticing about this scripture. It mentions "the grace of God that bringeth salvation". In other words it brings salvation right now. That is in the present, isn't it? Yes, God's grace brought salvation long before now, and if the world stands his grace will still be there to cleanse sinners, but what we are interested in is his grace right now in the present. Then notice, after it told us how to live in denying worldly lusts and that we should live soberly, righteously, and godly

it gives this, "in this present world." Not in the world of yesterday, and not in the world of tomorrow, but in this world right now. There are plenty of folks who have plans for tomorrow, but just think how quickly those plans can be banished and never materialize.

Friends, it is not safe to build your hope on "hearsay". You need the facts, the present facts. Hearsay can get you into a lot of trouble. Another expression often used is "they say". Who might "they" be? Well, it might be most anyone. The boy down at the corner service station or the friendly barber, or the man at the grocery store. It might be from the lady who lives next door, or just down the street. She could pass what she heard as she spoke to you across the backyard fence. I have a poem for you that brings out the comparison of what "some say", "they say", "they think", and "they tell". Now, listen to this poem:

Present Experience

Some say that in heaven a sinner
There shall never, no, never be
found,

But that in this lowland of sorrow
To the lusts of the flesh we are bound;
But those who have come to the Savior
Have washed in the all-cleansing tide,
Are now singing of perfect salvation
As they stand, all redeemed, by his
side.

They think that the Spirit of promise,
Which to the disciples was given
To fit and prepare them for service,
Has long since gone back up to heaven:
But we find that the promise included
The saints that are living today,
For he strengthens and comforts and
guides us,
And says he'll be with us alway.

They say that away in a new world
In a city with streets of pure gold,
That after our life's race is ended
We shall drink of its pleasures untold;
But the spiritual city of Zion,
We enter through Jesus today,
And the saints in its glory are
walking;
Their sins have been all washed away.

They tell us that over in glory
All the Christians shall there be made
one,
But here amid so much confusion
That surely can never be done;
But the glory that Jesus has given
From Babylon bondage sets free,
And the sanctified saints now are
dwelling
In a perfect and sweet unity.

I hope you like that poem. I am sure
that what God has for us in the future
will be fine. He can make a world so
wonderful, as we have it now, and so

well supplied with food, water, oxygen,
and clothing, yes, and loved ones to
give us comfort and strength. Then I
know that he is able to provide for us
in the future. But what the folks need
today is a present salvation. There
are some people who have found this
pearl of great price and are really en-
joying it right now. Are you one of
those? I am glad to say that I am. God
still has a remnant right here in this
world. Listen to this scripture, "God
hath not cast away his people which he
foreknew. Wot ye not what the scrip-
ture saith of Elias? how he maketh
intercession to God against Israel,
saying, Lord, they have killed thy
prophets, and digged down thine altars;
and I am left alone, and they seek my
life. But what saith the answer of God
unto him? I have reserved to myself
seven thousand men, who have not bowed
the knee to the image of Baal. Even
so then at this present time also there
is a remnant according to the election
of grace." Romans 11:2-5 Please no-
tice that it said "in this present time".
I accept it that way, do you?

RESULTS OF NEGLECT

Satan works on human minds, leading them to think that there is wonderful knowledge to be gained apart from God. By deceptive reasoning he led Adam and Eve to doubt God's word, and to supply its place with a theory that led to disobedience. And his reasoning is doing today what it did in Eden. Teach-

ers who mingle with the education they are giving the sentiments of infidel authors, plant in the minds of youth thoughts that will lead to distrust of God and transgression of His law.

A student may go through all the grades of the schools and colleges of today. He may devote all his powers to acquiring knowledge. But unless he has a knowledge of God, unless he obeys the laws that govern his being, he will destroy himself. By wrong habits he loses his power of self-appreciation. He loses self-control. He can not reason correctly about matters that concern him most closely. He is reckless and irrational in his treatment of mind and body. By wrong habits he makes of himself a wreck. Happiness he can not have; for his neglect to cultivate pure, healthful principles places him under the control of habits that ruin his peace. His years of taxing study are lost; for he has destroyed himself. He has misused his physical and mental powers, and the temple of the body is in ruins. He is ruined for this life and for the life to come. By acquiring earthly knowledge he thought to gain a treasure; but by laying his Bible aside, he sacrificed a treasure worth every thing else.

The word of God is to be our guide. We are to educate our children in the truths found therein. It is an inexhaustible treasure; but men fail to find this treasure, because they do not search until it is within their possession. Very many are content with a surface work, taking for granted that they have all that is essential. They take the sayings of others for truth, being too indifferent to put themselves to diligent, earnest labor, represented in the word as digging for hidden treasure.

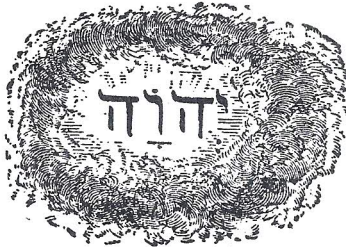

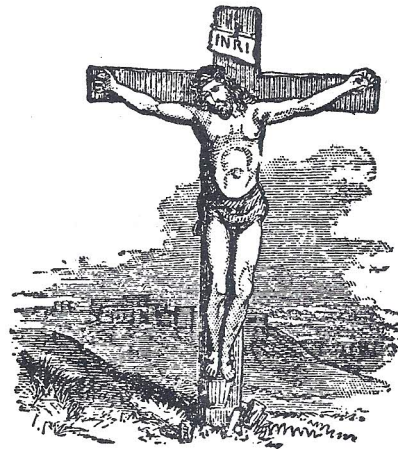

If you are able to work and have an extra day or two you might consider giving it to the Lord by helping work on the dining hall addition on the Monark campground.

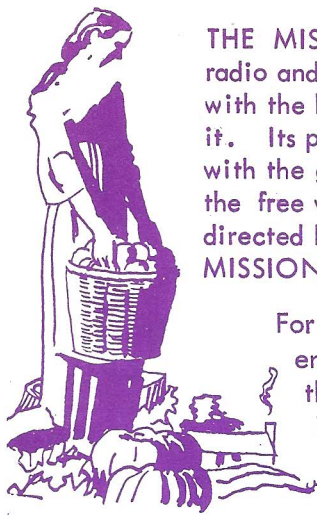
