Family Ties

Radio Broadcast for week of July 25, 1971 (See back page for list of stations.)

"For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named, That he would grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man; That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; that ye, being rooted and grounded in love, May be able to comprehend with all saints what is the breadth, and length, and depth, and height; And to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge, that ye might be filled with all the fulness of God. Now unto him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us, Unto him be glory in the church by Christ Jesus throughout all ages, world without end. Amen." Eph. 3:14-21

A very pleasant good morning to all of my dear brothers and sisters in the Lord. Let me tell you what I want to talk about for a few minutes today. It is the wonderful family of God. Did you notice that this 15th verse refers to, "the whole family in heaven and earth". You see, some of the redeemed of God's children have already passed beyond the bounds of earthly ties where they are free from pain and sorrow. But others in this spiritual family yet remain in a natural body which is subject to pain and some times sorrow of heart because we are still in the world but not of the world. But we are looking forward to a grand and wonderful reunion one of these days when all of the redeemed of all ages shall be one unbroken family around the throne of God. Won't that be a wonderful day?

There is something about family ties and relationship which binds brothers and sisters and of course, other relatives also quite closely together. They

are interested in one another and they are concerned about each other. Of course these natural relationships are broken sometimes through jealousy, hatred, and various other evil influences. But I am speaking about family ties in the natural sense. It is a real thrill to me to see a family so closely knit together that they cannot be separated but often they work together in the same type of occupation or maybe side by side. Sometimes certain enterprises are operated almost exclusively by a family. Now just as this is true in the natural, even more so is it true in the spiritual family of God. You see, one of the things that holds people together is the fact that they have something in common. They see alike and think alike. How true this is with God's children. They share in a common cause of promoting the saving grace of our Lord, in carrying out the great commission to preach the gospel in all the world. So naturally when they meet together they have a common

cause and they are an encouragement one to another. Who of us can tell the value of a friend that sticketh closer than a brother. This would of course be the fellowship that we have with the father. Then as we walk in the light as he is in the light we have fellowship one with another and the blood of Jesus Christ his son cleanseth us from all sin. Sometimes even brothers and sisters in the flesh do not understand the behavoir of one who is led by the spirit of God.

So many have made the remark that receiving the printed copies of The Mission Trail is to them like receiving a letter from the family. Well, this is exactly the purpose which we desire the little newsletter to serve each week. It seems to me that it binds us closer together as we share the joys and sorrows of one another in the Lord. So I am going to share with you a part of this letter from West Virginia which I recently received:

"Dear Brother and Sister Murphey,

"Greetings in Jesus precious name. Your good letter rec'd and am glad that you are interested in the Lord's work.

". . . Yes it is far more important that we are brothers and sisters in the Lord than to be just in the family. Often times if your family do not approve of your devotion to the Lord, they can make it quite difficult. But the Lord knows all about us. Thank the Lord for saving my soul.

"I was converted December 9th, 1911. I was quite young but I meant by the help of the Lord to live for Him. I find that the tests that come our way are beneficial, if we seek the mind of the Lord to lead us through.

"I am sending you a little poem that I wrote Jan. 2, 1962 about my conversion. How I thank the Lord for leading me to a group of people that set a good example. "May your hearts be encouraged to go on in Gospel work until the Master says, 'Come up higher'.

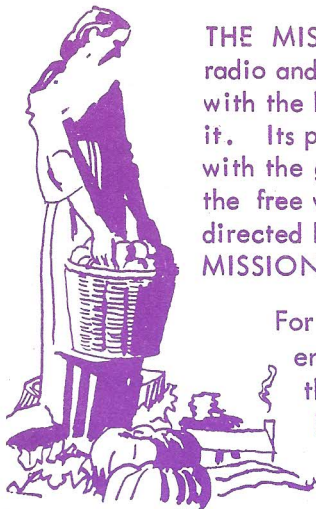
