Radio Broadcast for week of October 17, 1971 (See back page for list of stations)

Good morning, friends. I am glad for the privilege to come your way once again. This is a wonderful way to make a short visit in your home or car and still not have all the traveling to do, but we just let the radio waves do the traveling. I hope this finds you encouraged in the Lord. Listen to this scripture: "For we dare not make ourselves of the number, or compare ourselves with some that commend themselves: But they measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves, are not wise." 2 Cor. 10:12. Now, just who do you think is approved of the Lord or will be approved of him in that final day of judgment? The ones who approve themselves, or commend themselves? Well, not according to the scriptures.

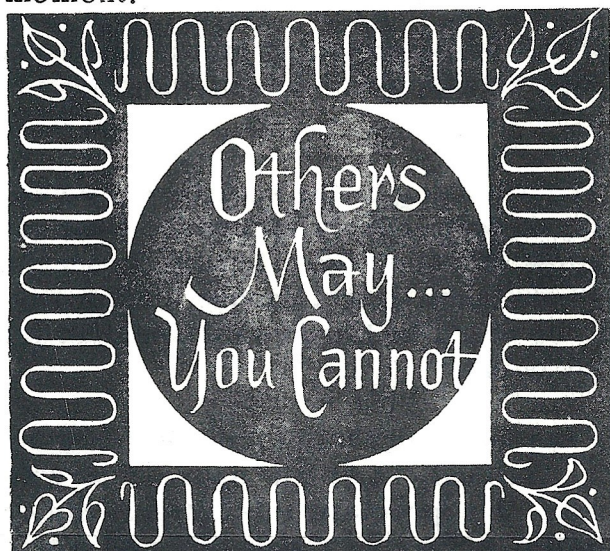
We are living in such a loose age that many seem to think it just doesn't matter very much what they do or think. Therefore, they give themselves over to the flesh to do many wicked things. But to put it in better words allow me to use this scripture found in Romans 1:29-32. "And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a reprobate mind, to do those things which are not convenient: Being filled with all unrighteousness, fornication, wickedness, covetousness, maliciousness; full of envy, murder, debate, deceit, malignity; whispers, Backbiters, haters of God, despiteful, proud, boasters, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents, Without understanding, covenantbreakers, without natural affection, implacable, unmerciful: Who knowing the judgment of God, that they which commit such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but have pleasure in them that do them."

From looking at the scripture I would say it does make a difference what you allow in your life. But by looking at others, you might excuse almost anything which the Lord would condemn you for doing.

I recently had a letter from Sister Mary A. Halfhill. Let me share this with you. I appreciate this letter. Sister Halfhill lives in California and she is 90 years of age! I quote: "Dear Bro. and Sister Murphey, Greetings in Jesus dear name. I am sending you one of the tracts I wrote you about. A dear old child of God sent me one several years ago. As far as I know he is still living in a nursing home in Fla. I read it over quite often. It's been a blessing to me. When I read of victory on the back and realize I have it, I am very grateful to our Saviour for His wonderful love and mercy to me all these years. He is all the world to me, thank His dear name. I am well as usual for

my 90 years. God bless you and your work. . . Remember me in prayer that I will be faithful a little while longer. I feel we are living near the end of this age. What joy it will be to spend eternity with the redeemed of all ages. Love and prayers." --Sister Halfhill.

Now, would you like to know what this tract has to say which has brought so much comfort and joy to this sister who is 90 years of age? It is entitled: "Others May. . . You Cannot." You may have seen a copy of this before. But be that as it may. I think these thoughts are worthy of being passed on to you right here over the air. So listen for a moment:



"If God has called you to be really like Jesus he will draw you into a life of crucifixion and humility, and put upon you such demands of obedience, that you will not be able to follow other people, or measure yourself by other Christians, and in many ways he will seem to let other people do things which he will not let you do.

"Other Christians and ministers who seem very religious and useful, may push themselves, pull wires, and work schemes to carry out their plans, but

you cannot do it, and if you attempt it, you will meet with such failure and rebuke from the Lord as to make you sorely penitent.

"Others may boast of themselves, of their work, of their successes, of their writings, but the Holy Spirit will not allow you to do any such thing, and if you begin it, he will lead you into some deep mortification that will make you despise yourself and all your good works.

"Others may be allowed to succeed in making money, or may have a legacy left to them, but it is likely God will keep you poor, because he wants you to have something far better than gold, namely, a helpless dependence upon him, that he may have the privilege of supplying your needs day by day out of an unseen treasury.

"The Lord may let others be honored and put forward, and keep you hidden in obscurity, because he wants to produce some choice fragrant fruit for his coming glory, which can only be produced in the shade. He may let others be great, but keep you small. He may let others do a work for him and get the credit for it, but he will make you work and toil on without knowing how much you are doing; and then to make your work still more precious he may let others get credit for the work which you have done, and thus make your reward ten times greater when Jesus comes.

"The Holy Spirit will put a strict watch over you, with a jealous love, and will rebuke you for little words and feelings or for wasting your time, which other Christians never feel distressed over. So make up your mind that God is an infinite Sovereign, and has a right to do as he pleases with his own. He may

not explain to you a thousand things which puzzle your reason in his dealings with you, but if you absolutely sell yourself to be his love slave, he will wrap you up in a jealous love, and bestow upon you many blessings which come only to those who are in the inner circle.

"Settle it forever, then, that you are to deal directly with the Holy Spirit, and that he is to have the privilege of tying your tongue, or chaining your hand, or closing your eyes, in ways that he does not seem to use with others. Now, when you are so possessed with the living God that you are, in your secret heart, pleased and delighted over this peculiar, personal, private, jealous guardianship and management of the Holy Spirit over your life, you will have found the vestibule of Heaven.

VICTORY

"When you are forgotten or neglected, or purposely set at naught, and you smile inwardly, glorying in the insult or the oversight, because thereby counted worthy to suffer with Christ--that is victory.

"When your good is evil spoken of, when your wishes are crossed, your taste offended, your advice disregarded, your opinions ridiculed, and you take it all in patient, loving silence--that is victory.

"When you are content with any food, any raiment, any climate, any society, any solitude, any interruption by the will of God--that is victory.

"Lord Jesus, make thyself to me
A living, bright Reality:
More present to faith's vision keen
Than any earthly object seen;
More dear, more intimately nigh
Than e'en the dearest earthly tie."

End of quote from this tract entitled "Others May, You Cannot."

They wouldn't even tell me why, just made me turn around and get out. After a good cry and prayer I took the accordion back to El Centro to the music Co. where I take accordion lessons and they are keeping it for me. I felt pretty blue. . . . Then thought that nothing could touch my life except the Lord permit it. So that was a good help. After waiting 4 hours I tried crossing again with out the accordion and they let me across just fine. I have done this week after week, bringing the accordion, and they rarely mention what is in the suitcase, but this time wouldn't even tell me why. Any way as I was going to tell you. When I got home I sat down and read the Mission Trail from front to back and it was such a blessing to me. I know it is a blessing to many folks. The Lord is blessing us still and we feel His sweet presence with us, in our personal lives, and in the services. Last night we had young peo-

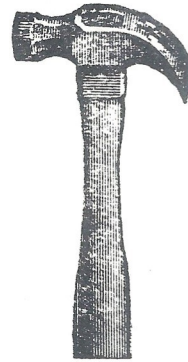

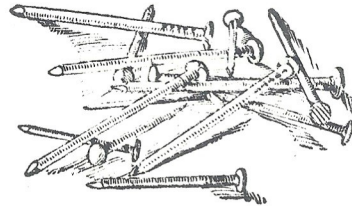

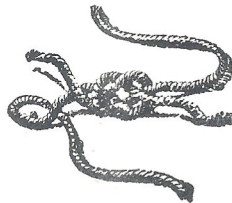
